## DeSClpher

- A Life Sciences competition on February $4^{\text {th }}$ (hosted by BHSS) was discussed at a previous meeting as a possible event that MUNSS would donate to. However, confusion of the event specifics (including budget) and contraindications of interfaculty collaboration pushed a decision back until further information could be presented.
- Feedback from BHSS:
- Will the teams be interfaculty? The teams of 2-3 can be interfaculty or faculty specific. The event is not being advertised as either, so students registering their team can decide whether or not they want an interfaculty team.
- What are the budget specifics? BHSS has budgeted $\$ 129.00$ for yard signs (not $\$ 450.00$ that was previously thought), looking to book rooms in IAHS (as it is cost free), and the banquet will be at the CIBC hall or Councillors Chambers, which is $\$ 200.00$ for the entire day.
- What is the asking donation? \$150.00, however this amount is not set in stone.
- Will there be delegate packages? This is something that could be a consideration based on the amount of donations received.
- MUNSS comments:
- The MUNSS donation should be dependant on whether nursing teams will participate within the event. If no teams are likely to participate then would be no direct benefit.
- From a poll within the MUNSS committee there is very minor to no interest in attending the event.
- This event could be beneficial in a sense that it would enhancing networking and developing platforms to strengthen that interfaculty collaboration. Nursing is a profession that requires interprofessionalism and this could be platform to base that foundation on.
- Based on the topics that are outlined, this event would be more solely directed toward the upper year nursing students because most of those topics have not be covered in its entirety. This leads to only half the of the nursing student body eligible to participate.
- The upper year nursing students feel they just wouldn't have time to dedicate towards this event due to the businesses and demand of their schedules.
- There is also topics outlined that are not covered within the nursing curriculum and this can hinder participation as well.
- There are 3 question periods, one that is done as a group, then individually, then finally the the top 5 groups competing.
- Based on that information it is even more prevalent that performance will be hindered to the lower year nursing students and the nursing faculty itself. Nursing students do not have enough background in some topics, like other faculties to fully participate.

## Survey Engagement

- Course and tutor evaluations close Wednesday, December $7^{\text {th }}$. The exit survey for students graduating this semester closes Friday, December $9^{\text {th }}$.
- Currently only $30 \%$ of students have filled out their Level 4 exit survey forms, which is an increase from less than 5\% last year. The program manager has a goal of $50 \%$, which is an ideal goal.
- To achieve this goal, students have been receiving numerous email, Avenue2Learn announcements and social media reminders to fill out the surveys.
- Other strategies to improve student participation:
- Having tutors/teachers reminding students when in class
- Have time set aside in class for students to fill-out the survey on a scantron or on their computer, but chose a method consistent within all courses.
- Having an incentive for completing the survey. For Psych students were given 3\% bonus on the final exam for survey completion. Another incentive would be not releasing final exam marks until the course survey is completed.
- Having students like level reps or teachers promote to students of the benefits of completing the survey in class. Emphasize that the surveys give students a voice to improve the program. It is direct impact on the quality of education students currently and incoming will benefit from.
- For improvements on current strategies are to include links within ALL email reminders so students can access the survey, have an extension on the closing date (It feels the survey closes too early) and to develop a method to terminate reminder emails once students complete the evaluation.


## Event Proposals

- TedTalk
- Event open to students on February $28^{\text {th }}$, however only a limited number of delegates can actually attend (as per TedTalk policies). Attendees are chosen through an application basis and in the past there has been equal representation of faculties in attendance (with an average of 4-6 nursing students in
attendance).
- Event information:
- The budget indicates that donation support will be directed to either catering, transportation, equipment, promotions, packages or delegates or workshops.
- Currently the cost to attend is unknown and the applications for attending have not yet been released.
- The theme of the event is "metamorphosis is the paradox of change".
- Benefit packages for donations:
- $\$ 250.00-\$ 500.00$ social media and news letter promotion of society
- $\$ 750.00$ banner promotion at event
