- Introductions/ housekeeping

# Budgets

- Ensure receipts are obtained for any purchases. They cannot be debit or credit slips.
- When a purchase is made ensure a cheque requisition form is filled out.
- Any questions concerning budgets contact Joyce at finance@munss.ca
- We are expecting to receive around \$70,000 in student fees for MUNSS
- The breakdown for individual budgets for the entire 2016/2017 year are as follows:
  - Each level position receives \$100/site (Level 1, 2, 3, 4, RPN-BScN and accelerated for all sites)
  - RNAO receives \$2,100
  - Social receives \$10,000 (for activities including nursing formal)
  - Donations receives \$3,500 (\$2,000 has already been used for Shinerama

     charity for Cystic Fibrosis)
  - Awards receives \$3,500
  - Communications receives for \$600 (for email and website maintenance)
  - Each VP will receive \$125/site for L1 Anatomy gifts
  - VP McMaster and VP Mohawk receive a combined \$1750 for MUNSS days since they are done together at the campus.
  - VP Conestoga receives \$1000 for Conestoga MUNSS day and \$2000 for Conestoga initiative
  - CNSA receives \$30,000 (large portion of this budget is directed towards paying our CNSA Chapter registration fees

#### Tiger Cats Game

 Anmolpreet (President) has been contacted by a representative from the Tiger Cats organization to create a McMaster specific section for an upcoming Tiger Cats CFL football game

- The tickets would come at cost of \$30.00 for the Coors Light Patio or Section 208. This would be for a game on Friday, October, 28<sup>th</sup> at 7pm.
- On the Facebook page most members have voted for this to be an open social event.
- There would an issue of transportation. There is local transit for McMaster students, however for Conestoga students this is not applicable. This would create of barrier of who can attend if individuals need to arrange for own personal transportation or rise the ticket price for transportation costs.
- Another point of consideration was brought up by SRA representatives that students would already given a free game on Labour Day weekend and this October game may have little interest because the dates are so close. This may drop interest in the student body minimising our ticket sales.
- There is also no way of estimating ticket sales and guaranteeing sales.
  - It was mentioned to create a Facebook event page to help with this. However, Facebook pages are very vague. Students cannot be held to statement of "attending" or "interested" and it will cause conflict and issue for ticket sales.
- There was also concerns on the price, since the price is already \$30.00 and to add on top of that for profit seems to be too "high" in price. Although the tickets for our reserved section is an approximate \$60.00, but most students will not know this information and having the prices higher than \$30.00 will lower student interest
  - ➤ If the ticket prices were kept at \$30.00, then transportation would have to arranged individually or an expense by social.
- Based on these factors, it was mentioned that this event needs to re-evaluated, perhaps for a MUNSS only event and keep the ticket price as is.
  - A general vote was conducted for the MUNSS members present and less than half of those present were interested in actually attending.
  - Due to the little interest within our own group, it suggested to contact other faculties instead. However, Anmol mentioned a decision needs to made by Friday. It seems unrealistic to receive an answer by other faculties in the short amount of time.
  - Also a member mentioned that there would less interest in attending if drinking was not allowed as well. It was concern that EOHSS may question how we are practicing safe drinking. This could decrease sales even within our own group if it was a no drinking event.
  - It was suggested that since the interest is limited it might be best to "buy out" so many seats and sell the tickets at the cost of \$30.00. It would be a first come first serve for the tickets.
  - However, students are just getting into "the swing of things" and students may not reply in a sufficient of time. Students may not also want to become dedicated to a social event with the semester just beginning

and this kind of situation would apply to other faculties as well.

- It is apparent that this event is going to have little appeal to the student body and other faculties. The timing and price are just not ideal.
- Due to fact the coordinator needs an answer by Friday a decision needs to made today.

- o Agreed to keep contact for coordinator for perhaps a future MUNSS social event.
- SRA and MSU Introduction and Initiatives
  - The SRA is the student representative assembly, the governing body of the MSU.
     They represent students from every faculty and vote on issues on behalf of all students.
    - SRA does not represent Conestoga or Mohawk students
  - o The SRA and MSU wanted to present goals for the 2016/2017 year:
    - Improve collaboration and communication with the MUNSS
    - Promote involvement for students within the school community
    - Collaborate with the Student Success Center in hope of arranging for Human Resources Manager for presentations on how to construct resumes and prepare for interviews for hospital employment. Would also like to arrange for nurses from different specialities to join and help with these presentations as well.
    - Allisa (SRA) mentioned this event is similar to the Speed Dating event last year hosted by MUNSS. MSU mentioned it was similar, but they are going to focus more on the aspect of assisting students with resumes and not so much on the workplace it self.
    - MSU is also willing to pay for expenses to host this event.
    - Gain access for Hole in the Wall and Health Sciences Lounge for space for nursing students. Also, gain access for MUNSS located within the Health Sciences Lounge for use by executive members and president. The goal is to increase space for nursing students to utilize.
    - Conduct a MSU presidential forum. Typically nursing students do not vote on presidential elections, so MSU wants to bring the presidents to the nursing students by having presentations within the nursing classrooms.
    - Start a McMaster Initiative on Facebook. Send messages to MSU to participate. Answer thought provoking questions, voice opinions, and engage in discussions. It will be a bi-weekly post on Facebook. Check out the MSU and SRA Facebook page for further information.

#### Concerns:

 That the Conestoga and Mohawk college students will not have access to the additional spaces at the McMaster site since they don't get an access

- ➤ MSU is planning on having a meeting with the associate Dean to have a discussion about this issue further. The main issue is however, that all the college students would have to go to security to get their student card activated. This is not ideal, but is the only solution for the time being.
- Issue that Mohawk and Conestoga students cannot vote on presidential campaigns or other issues. MSU would like to to discuss this issue further as well, in order to open all events and get the colleges more involved.
- Alumni guest suggested MSU to have a conversation to John Landene to help with the college versus university identity nursing students have.

## • CPR with Heather Whitfield

- o Raised \$600 during the summer with the HCP-CPR classes
- Heather Whitfield, the instructor, gave MUNSS \$5 back from every student registered
- Anmol mentioned this could be a good fundraiser for CNSA as all nursing students require CPR.

### • CNSA Regional Conference

- Regional conference is September 30-October 2<sup>nd</sup>, hosted by Ryerson University in Toronto
- McMaster has 32 students currently going!
- CNSA team is currently running their first fundraiser, which is an empties bottle drive
  - they are asking for empty bottle donations to assist with conference travel accommodations and other expenses for students attending

### • Finance

- Finish budgets as soon as possible so funding can be done for first term (due latest October 3<sup>rd</sup> 2359 to finance@munss.ca)
- For any purchases please include an invoice with your name, position and what the purchase was for
- Level 1 representatives would like ideas on what to events could be done for budget planning
  - Suggestions included: Level 1 anatomy review session (Dr. Helli will only agree to this if all sites receive a review session), donation for Relay for Life, or collaborate with other positions for social activities
  - Strongly suggest to contact Dr. Helli to set up a review session as students find this very beneficial before exams
  - Faculty mentioned that there are transition reports available for all
    positions to outline duties, responsibilities, and other various things that
    could help the Level 1 representatives as well.
    - Anmol has mentioned she has the transition reports that she can bring for the Level 1 reps for use.
- Finally, finance would like members to not over spend or spend recklessly. Look into alternation and cheaper methods of making purchases- be aware of your

purchasing amounts, and always be cost-effective

 MUNSS will be under review engagement for our finances this year with an accounting company- this will need to be done before we can get our funding for this year
